MAGS 2011 SCHOLARSHIP EXAMINATION SUCCESS

The 2011 New Zealand Scholarship results again demonstrate the outstanding academic successes experienced by Mount Albert Grammar School students. Scholarship provides recognition and monetary reward to top students in their last year of schooling. Scholarship exams enable candidates to be assessed against challenging standards, and are demanding for even the most able candidates in each subject.

From the NZQA website:

"As a general rule, the number of Scholarships awarded in each subject represents about 3% of the national Level 3 cohort in that subject." (The national cohort for each subject comprises the set of candidates who are entered for at least 14 credits in that subject at Level 3.)

"In 2011 some 10,271 candidates were entered in the New Zealand Scholarship examinations. These candidates made 19,780 scholarship subject entries from which 3,449 subject scholarships were achieved at either Scholarship grade (3,050) or Outstanding Scholarship grade (399)."

These figures clearly demonstrate what an achievement it is for student to earn scholarship success.

In 2011, MAGS students were awarded 46 Scholarships - 44 Scholarship (S) and 2 Outstanding (0) - as reward for their academic ability, preparation and perseverance in their chosen subjects.

<u>Scholarships</u> were achieved, by MAGS students, across 12 different subjects - Art History, Biology, Chemistry, Economics, English, Geography, History, Mathematics with Calculus, Media Studies, Physical Education, Physics and Statistics and Modelling.

The <u>Outstanding Scholarships</u> were achieved in History and Physical Education, and particular congratulations go to Lucy Harrison and Tea Williams respectively.

Multiple subject Scholarships were awarded to 12 MAGS students - 7 achieving 2 subject Scholarships and 5 achieving 3 subject scholarships each. These young scholars are well-deserving of their outstanding academic success.
