Junior Dux (Girls)

This award is also known as the Newton Wickham CBE Scholarship of Excellence.

This year's Girls' Junior Dux came to us from Balmoral Intermediate School. She was placed in our top-stream class in 2020 and took our accelerated course in Mathematics, sitting Level Two at the end of last year. She has 22 NCEA credits in Level Two Mathematics and 23 at Level One. She has Excellence endorsements in both.

In her core subjects she scored 400/400 last year in the first semester.

Junior Dux (Boys)

This award is also known as the Newton Wickham CBE Scholarship of Excellence. This year's Boys' Junior Dux came to us from Ponsonby Intermediate School. Within the Sports Pillar, last year he was part of the MAGS Football program and was a valuable member of the 14 Victory team and the 15th Grade Knockout Cup side. He played Futsal for the school and represented MAGS at the NZ Secondary School Futsal tournament. In 2021 he also represented MAGS at the Central Zone Athletics championship.

The recipient of this award has achieved Excellence in her Academic program. She competed in the Auckland Science Fair and has gained 39 NCEA credits, all of these at Excellence level.

Her service to the school is demonstrated through being a Year 10 Interform Captain, a member of the Interact Club and involved in the Duke of Edinburgh Award.

Top Year 9 Girls Academic

Last year's girls' winner gained 394 grad points out of 400 and was a member of the MTA class, sitting NCEA Level One Mathematics. She gained 16 excellence credits and four learning recognition credits in NCEA: the maximum possible.

In her core subjects she gained first place in Science and second in English and Social Studies.

Top Year 9 Boys Academic

Last year's boys' winner gained 395 grad points out of 400 and gained second places for Social Studies and Science in his class. He gained Excellence for all assessments in these subjects as well as Excellence in all his academic subjects listed on his report. He was also involved in Spoken Word.

Best All-Round Year 9 Boy

Today's recipient is an outstanding young man who is to be congratulated on his excellent commitment and involvement across all Pillars of Mount Albert Grammar School. Staff and students comment on this student's high level of positive engagement and enthusiasm for learning. He extends himself into all areas of MAGS life and that is why he is to be congratulated today.

Within the Sports Pillar, this student was a valuable member of the MAGs under 14A Rugby team, which finished second in their Auckland rugby campaign. He was the sports

representative of his mentor class, a member of the MAGS Junior Rowing Academy and was competitive in both the school athletics and swimming sports.

Within the Arts and Cultural Pillar, he is a member of our PUNA unit and has regularly given service to our school through presenting the karakia at the boys morning assemblies. Junior Dux Artium

The recipient of the Junior Dux Artium trophy for 2021 is a student who has demonstrated a dedication to the school across all pillars, however he has shown special talent in and love for the Arts. This can be seen in the breadth of his involvement in both Year 9 and 10. In Year 10 he was a student of Music, Dance and Drama. In Drama, he was an extension student gaining 17 credits at Merit or above in NCEA Level 1, also achieving all other Year 10 Arts credits at Merit or above.

He was a member of the Junior debating team who won 7/10 of their debates in 2021, had a significant part in the Sheilah Winn Shakespeare team, and was also active in Theatresports, Spoken Word Club and the Musical Theatre Group.

Also in 2021 he auditioned for and was selected for the Centennial Boys Choir who enjoyed a huge success at the Big Sing Auckland competition and was selected to go to the national finals, which unfortunately they could not attend because of Covid lockdown.

This young man has been twice awarded a Junior Arts badge for his commitment to the Arts and this year has also been chosen as the Most Promising Male Actor in the Junior School. As well this year, he creates another first in Junior Arts – he is the first person to be awarded the Junior Dux Artium in both Year 9 and 10.

Junior Victor Ludorum

The 2021 winner of Junior Victor Ludorum has competed in two Premier sports at MAGS. He has been part of the Hockey Academy for two years and played in the Boys 1st XI Hockey side in 2021.

He was also part of the Rowing Academy in Years 9 and 10 and won a Bronze medal at Maadi in 2021. He won 4 medals at Auckland Champs, and coaches have said he is an integral member of the rowing squad.
