Tonagn Student Rep since 2021. Yr 12 student


Background: I am a musician, book worm, one of six kids, strong Christian believer, with pure Tongan blood flowing rapidly through my veins.

Stanley FIFITA


Tongan – Student rep since 2022 Yr 11 student
