From the Headmaster

Another challenging week for MAGS has been met with a fantastic response from the school community. News yesterday from the Health Service that a second historical case of COVID-19 had been detected in the school necessitated a request that all MAGS students and staff are swabbed over

the next few days.

It is fair to say that the last 24 hours has seen MAGS people presenting themselves en masse for testing. As I sat with my daughter yesterday at the St Lukes White Cross Testing Station, I was flanked by MAGS students either side – and it was even a former MAGS student who carried out our tests!

With it now being close to three weeks since students were at school, the primary purpose of testing is to provide further assurance to individuals and the community that any risk of further infection is low.

The Public Health Service has confirmed that it is safe for normal lessons to resume on-site at MAGS on Monday and as such we are expecting to welcome all students and staff for an 8.45am start.

Let's think back to how successfully we operated as a school at Alert Level 2 back in May. We can take great confidence from how we restarted the year and can draw on the hope and courage we displayed first time around.

Preparation for school on Monday



We are pleased to be starting back at school on Monday.

While the recent testing request from the Auckland Regional Public Health Service (ARPHS) may have created some concern in our MAGS community, it must be <u>repeated</u> that ARPHS has declared it safe for students to return, saying "the school can open on Monday, 31 August for all staff and students".

advice and minimise risk. The last two weeks in Alert Level 3 will have reduced the possibility of further transmission amongst students.

"ARPHS considers that the risk to the school community is low, but is asking that any sick

student stays at home after the school opens fully on Monday, even if they do not have COVID-19 symptoms."

Update on school events

Due to COVID-19, some school events have been cancelled and others postponed – and the situation remains fluid depending on Alert Levels. At this stage, the Student Quiz Night and Shave for a Cure have been cancelled.

The Artistry in Action dance concert has been rescheduled to September 17 and 18, and the school is awaiting advice about whether it can go ahead as intended with an audience. Because of this, ticket sales have been suspended, and current ticket holders should hold on to their tickets and await further advice.



The Year 13 Drama Production has been rescheduled to October 22 and 23. It is hoped that the School Ball will still be able to go ahead on September 25.

School sport at Level 2

All games that were scheduled to be played during the Alert Level 3 lockdown have been recorded as no result and will not be rescheduled.

The season games that are scheduled for the remainder of the term will continue as planned under Alert Level 2, but will only begin once the restrictions have been lifted on gathering size numbers.

Normal school sports training will resume but there will be the same sanitary measures that were in place the last time we were at Alert Level 2. MAGS will be following the MoE and MoH guidelines for schools.

St John award for Sharnah

In an outstanding example of service, Sharnah Pacsoe-Scouller has been named the St John Central District Cadet of the Year for the Northern Region. Sharnah started with St John Youth in 2010 and is now a Cadet Sergeant at the Pt Chev division.

Her new role means she will lead and instruct cadets in her district.

"District Cadet of the Year is a really cool role that means I get to inspire others and share my ideas to make St John Youth better for cadets."

As one of of the eight District Cadets of the Year in the Northern Region, she has now been allowed to apply to be St John's Regional Cadet of the Year, and, if chosen for that, could go on to compete against candidates from the Central and Southern Regions for National Cadet of the Year.



Sharnah said she had gained a lot from St John over the years.

"What appeals to me about St John Youth is that it's such a diverse program where you can learn different things. From First Aid through to leadership, they give you the teachings and resources where you can grow, gain so many different skills, and achieve some cool badges," she said.

"I'm en route to getting my Grand Prior, which is signed by the Queen and awarded by the Governor-General, which is the highest award in the program, and these skills have helped me work towards this."

Applications for out-of-zone enrolments should be done online and must be received by **Wednesday**, **2 September**, **2020**. Should a ballot be required for out-of-zone enrolments, this will occur on **Wednesday**, **9 September**, **2020**.
