Award-winning artist's works on show

Visitors to the MAGS Centenary Art Show will have the chance to view (and buy) two artworks by award-winning Albertian artist Jessica Gurnsey. Last night, Jessica repeated her success of last year in the National Youth Art Competition, again winning first prize for her age group (15-19 Years) for her painting Shady at Midnight. Last year she won in that same age group and won the overall award at the National Youth Art Competition. Following that, she became the youngest person (at 18) to win the prestigious \$20,000 Adam Portraiture Award. She is pictured with her two acrylic on canvas works in the Art Show: Circus (at top) and Lights! Camera ... Jessica (a Year 13 at MAGS last year) was a Visual Art Leader for Ceramics and Painting. She won the People's Choice Award at the Art Show last year and the Trophy for Excellence in Painting when she was at MAGS. Jessica is now studying Commerce at Victoria University.
