Junior Inter-Form winners revealed



On Tuesday and Wednesday, there were plenty of hard-fought contests as Finals Day wrapped up the 2020 Junior School Inter-Form Class Competition, with prizes of pizza lunches or a trip to the movies up for grabs. For Year 9 Boys and Girls and Year 10 Boys and Girls, points gained in the finals day challenges were added to those gathered throughout the year and the winning form classes were announced.



The year-long competition is a fun series of challenges, with classes gaining points depending on their placings in each event. Extra points are given for participation, support, fair play and team work.

The competition includes both academic, arts and sporting challenges, and aims to help

junior students settle into high school life and get to know each other and the school, while learning new skills and games.

On finals day – overseen by Physical Education Teacher Ms Ripley – they played games such as Tug of War, Long Ball and Killer Ball, and variations on Basketball, Hockey and Football.

Overall winners are treated to a movie, while the winners on finals day get a pizza lunch. This year, 09CGL (Year 9 Boys) won overall and shared top place on finals day with 09GRW. So 09GRW get pizza lunch, and 09CGL go to a movie and score the pizza.

Overall winner for Year 9 Girls was 09FRS, and they took out the finals day.

Overall winner for Year 10 Boys was 10NYR, while 10DAL won finals day.

Overall Year 10 Girls winner was 10NOM, who also won the sporting challenges on finals day.

Outdoor Education develops personal characteristics through outdoor pursuits with multi-day camps providing the most effective way of doing this.

Outdoor Ed Teacher Mr Whitehead said, "Last week, 110 students participated in two camps in the Kaimai Ranges near Karangahake Gorge. Students slept in tents, prepared and cooked all of their food, participated in group initiative activities such as using each other to climb over a 4m wall, fill a punctured drum with water and build a raft. They also took part in an overnight tramp, a river traverse, river tubing, archery and night activities.
