Our top academic achievers from 2022 were celebrated this morning at our annual Scholars Assembly.

Current Year 13 students were joined by graduates from last year for the presentation of their Scholar Lion – a

marker of academic excellence at MAGS.

There were 349 students who achieved their NCEA Certificate endorsed with Excellence last year. This outstanding success was further complemented by the 118 NZ Scholarships gained, which included a National Premier Award winner and two Outstanding Scholar Awards. The 15 students with three or more Scholarships will have their names embossed in gold on our honours board.

The remarkable academic success of our 2022 student cohort is a triumph over the challenges of recent years. All of these students have had to carry out much of their schooling under the cloud of Covid. They have remained faithful to their studies. Their resilience and determination is an example to us all.

The event, MC'ed by Head Prefects Olivia Bennett and Taiarahia Moataane-Mika, was attended by Year 13s and saw the presentation of Scholar Lions to our top academic achievers in Year 12 and Year 13 last year as well as recognition of those who excelled in Scholarship.

Citations were read by Academic Dean Wariwck Gibbs for the 15 students who earned three or more Scholarships and whose names will go up on our Honours Board. Guest of honour was Brian McMath, who presented the June Gray Scholarship

#### Pair win aviation awards



Congratulations to two MAGS students who have had outstanding success in their pursuit of aviation qualifications.

In January, former student Lukasz Swain (top left) and current Year 13 Elliot Kitchener (top right) attended the Walsh Memorial Scout Flying School in Matamata after receiving scholarships from Rotary New Zealand.

Both started their aviation studies through Gateway at MAGS.

As a result of this course, Lukasz has won the prestigious Walsh Trophy, the first time a Rotary student has received this award since 2014. He also won a \$1250 flying award for the best all-round student in flying and exams and leadership, the top Air New Zealand Group award of \$5000 worth of flying toward his private pilot licence, a B787 Simulator training experience, plus a 'work experience day'. This prize was awarded by Grant Reidy of Air NZ "for a student with a strong desire to have a career flying for Air New Zealand". Elliot Kitchener won the ASPEQ Award of \$1500 towards flight training. This is awarded to a highly motivated student with a desire to progress towards a private pilot licence. Both also received their 'wings' for their first solo flights – awarded by Sarah Blyde, Project Engineer for Rocket Lab.

#### Use the MAGS App for instant alerts

Parents and students are urged to download the MAGS App to get instant alerts about school news and events.

Major school announcements, such as closures, will always be emailed to parents but this process is slower than receiving an alert via the app, which is free from the App Store or Google Play

MAGS parents can instantly access school announcements, Daily Notices, the Kamar portal, teachers' contact details, and notify the School if your child is absent. When notifying absences, you need to load your child's Student ID number. You should only need to do this once, and this helps us record absences more easily.

Parents and students can check the School Calendar and sync chosen events with their own Calendar, and choose Groups about which they wish to receive Alert Notifications. There are links to the MAGS Newsletter, Sports, Maps, and more ... Search for "SchoolAppsNZ", and load the app on to your phone. You can then search for and add as many schools as you want so you can receive alerts form multiple schools. If you are having trouble with this, click <u>here</u> to see how.

Sports Update

Huge numbers at Swimming Champs



Yesterday, we hosted our annual Swimming Sports Championships at the Mt Albert Aquatic Centre, with a big increase in entries and some exceptional performances. Personal best times were achieved by many of our school's top swimmers, and two school records were broken by Hunter Dobson in the 200m Freestyle (1:57.57) and the 50m Backstroke (27.03), after a stellar year in the pool in 2022 which saw Hunter win multiple national age group medals as well as represent New Zealand at the 2022 Junior Pan-Pacific Championships.

Our swimming champions are Bianca Chan (Junior Girls), Olivia Wheeler (Intermediate Girls), Anna McGowan (Senior Girls), Tarquinius Schwalger (Junior Boys), Palepua Afoa (Intermediate Boys), Tito Tipi (Senior Boys).

The MAGS Aquatic Team this year will consist of around 20 swimmers and looks forward to competing at the following events: CSA Zonal Championships, CSA Champ of Champs, CSA Individual Championships, and the NZ Secondary School Championships. MAGS Aquatic Director Mitchell Nairn said, "We are excited to see this group of talented swimmers represent their school moving forward into the school year for 2023." He added, "Congratulations also to the MAGS 'Day Boys' relay team who beat the MAGS 'House Boys' in an epic battle at the end of the swimming sports." #### More success in Waka Ama

MAGS students enjoyed plenty of success representing their clubs at the Waka Ama National Championships at Lake Karapiro in late January.

Marnie Toloa (pictured below right) claimed bronze in the U16 500m W1 final behind two other World Champ finalists.

She also completed at U19 level and was part of the W12 500m winning team, taking gold in the double hulled event.

LaRome Waihirere steered his team to victory in the U16 W6 1000m turn event final to take gold, and his team took silver in the U16 W6 final. He was also part of the U16 W12 500m team that claimed gold.

Marlin Toloa competed at U16 level in the W1 event and took bronze behind the current World Champion, and Worlds runnerup, setting a Personal Best. He also won the U19 men's



250m sprint final as a wildcard. His W6 team took silver in the 1000m turns event. Marlin and his team also claimed gold in the U16 W6 500m.

Chase Hartley and Tawhai Kaipo also competed and both returned solid results,
