From the Headmaster

Creating The School Our Parents Want

This week I received our MAGS 2019 Provisional Staffing Entitlement from the Ministry of Education. As expected, it confirms that the Ministry will fund 170 fulltime teaching staff for the current academic year – a number that, in essence, provides only a 'skeleton staff' for our school.

To rely on Ministry funding alone would be catastrophic for our MAGS vision – one which challenges every student to achieve personal excellence across our Four Pillars: Academic, Sport, Arts and Culture, and Service.

Parents and students rightly expect a first-class learning environment at MAGS – equal at least to any school in the country. The commitment of our Board of Trustees in funding 13 additional teaching roles (at an annual cost of over \$1 million above the Ministry allocation) is allowing us to provide the additional human resource to make our community expectations a reality.

The Board is also committing funds to ensure Ministry building projects such as the new Science Block are completed to the highest standard (landscaping etc. is not included in the MoE building budget).

Significant additional funds are also invested in our student support service where, for some anomalous reason, a school of 3000 such as MAGS only receives the same Guidance Staff funding as a school of 200 students!

To be able to target resourcing in this way relies on the school raising additional funds – much of that through the annual parent donation.

Without doubt, the rewards of raising a family in Auckland are accompanied by hard work, sacrifice and financial pressures. We have a wonderful parent community who donate so much of their time and support to the young people of MAGS but it is the *financial donations* that allow us to turn the ordinary into the extraordinary!

MAGS Footballer Genevieve Ryan, above right, took to the stage last night at the Halberg Awards as part of the Junior Football Ferns who were nominated for Team of the Year. Genevieve and her teammates appeared at NZ's premier sports awards ceremony because of their historic bronze medal at the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup in Uruguay late last year. It was the first time any New Zealand football team had made it into the World Cup finals, and the side emphasised their class by beating Canada 2-1 in the 3rd/4th playoff. Despite their heroics, the Junior Football Ferns were beaten to the Team of the Year honours by the Black Ferns Sevens, who won the Sevens Rugby World Cup and Gold at the Commonwealth Games.

Lots of buzz about farm



A "buzz group" session was held at the Donald Pearson Farm recently to formulate plans for its future.

The 75ha dairy farm was bequeathed to Young Farmers on the death of its owner, Donald Pearson. Its Whitford location is surrounded by lifestyle blocks both large and small but he was determined its future would not be as a subdivision.

Adithya Ashok in NZ U19 squad



Congratulations to First XI Boys Cricket captain Adithya Ashok (pictured above), who has been named in the NZ U19 squad to tour Bangladesh in April.

Cricket Head Coach Tony Sail said Adithya, a leg spin bowler and batsman, is only 16 years old but the national coaching staff will be monitoring his progress and performances with a view to possible selection for the U19 World Cup in South Africa next year.

He continues a fine tradition of MAGS players being selected for the U19 team. In the last three U19 World Cups, MAGS has had representation from Brett Randell, Aniket Parikh and most recently Katene Clarke. On top of that, last weekend the Boys First XI had a good

win over King's College, making 216/5 in their 50 overs before bowling King's out for 205 after 47 overs.

Maximus Soares (pictured right) scored 100no, having



recently scored 102 against Francis Douglas Memorial College, and Adithya bagged four wickets. An outstanding performance by all in the team.

The Girls First XI also had a convincing win, beating Mount Roskill Grammar by eight wickets. They restricted the opposition to 50/9 before making 51/2 for the victory.
