Our school's Senior Leadership Team has been expanded and strengthened with the addition of Allie Wright as a Deputy Principal and the confirmation of Christine Cato and Toby Powell as Deputy Principals (after acting in those roles last year).

Ms Wright, formerly our Director of Sport, will oversee Year 11s, Alumni, Social Media and Communications, Science, Sports, and the ASB MAGS Farm project.

Mrs Cato, who was HOF Social Sciences before being appointed Acting Deputy Principal, will oversee Te Puna o Wairaka and Languages as well as the school-wide staff professional learning programme.

Mr Powell, who was a Dean and Assistant Director of School House, will oversee Junior Boys, School Assemblies, and the Health, Outdoor Ed and PE Faculty.

She has held various leadership roles in Health and Physical Education, most recently as Head of Faculty. She has been instrumental in the development of the junior and senior Health programme at MAGS and was a Dean for a number of years. She is also currently involved in work for the Ministry of Education in Health. With a passion for health and wellbeing and an understanding of the

importance of a whole school approach, Ms Lythe looks forward to using her knowledge and experience to support the pastoral care team. She is also looking forward to working on student wellbeing initiatives and making a positive difference to the lives of young people in our community.

Jess lives on site at School House with her partner Tane, who is also a teacher. She also has family members who attend MAGS.



Mrs Moon (pictured left) joined MAGS in 2002, and became our Head of Arts Faculty and Head of Music. She previously taught at One Tree Hill College (HoD), Waitakere College and Avondale College. Prior to arriving in New Zealand she taught at Ljuba Nenadovic Junior High School.

Mrs Moon grew up in Belgrade, Serbia, where she obtained a Diploma in Music Management, a Bachelor of Music and, later, a Master of Music Pedagogy, and in 2016 was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts in London.

She has conducted the school orchestra at the Sydney Opera House, and taken music tours to Melbourne and New York.

Among her new duties will be overseeing Unitec courses, relief teaching and staff duty, and organising school-wide formal photos.

Mrs Moon and her husband Paul have four children.

Keep up to date with school news and events on the MAGS App – free from the App Store or Google Play. MAGS parents can instantly access school announcements, Daily Notices, the Kamar portal, teachers' contact details, and notify the School if your child is absent. When notifying absences, you need to load your child's Student ID number. You should only need to do this once, and this helps us record absences more easily.



Parents and students can check the School Calendar and sync chosen events with their own Calendar, and choose Groups about which they wish to receive Alert Notifications.
