school still relying on the uniform of its mother school. As such, the inaugural MAGS 1st XV players took to the field wearing the Oxford blue jersey of Auckland Grammar – but with the addition of a

That first encounter did not go the way of MAGS. But two years later, in 1924, the MAGS 1st XV won the first of its 22 Auckland Rugby schoolboy titles beating Auckland Grammar in the process. The first of our 19 All Blacks, Vic Butler, was also part of this champion team.



Rugby, along with the many other codes of our sporting pillar, has been such a source of pride for MAGS students throughout the past 100 years.

Passion, courage, identity and belonging – sport has played a critical role in shaping the MAGS culture of today. Our upcoming Centennial Celebrations will certainly provide a perfect forum for team-mates from years gone by to reconnect and reminisce.

But for now we wish our Rugby Boys all the best in their historic fixture tomorrow.

The Governor-General was present and, in her speech, the Rt Hon Dame Patsy Reddy said: "This award ceremony is well-deserved recognition for a challenge completed ... there's a great feeling of satisfaction that the moment has finally come and all the hard work and time spent has paid off."

Duke of Ed Award Leader Mr Belson said, "This is the pinnacle of the Award scheme and one which has taken at least a year of commitment to serving the community, meeting new challenges and demonstrating perseverance and resilience. Students have had opportunities to learn life skills, make connections and engage with their community. I am so proud of their commitment and efforts in completing this prestigious award. "Congratulations to all recipients on their outstanding achievement."

Young Enterprise Challenge

Sixty five students from Year 10 completed the Young Enterprise BP Challenge on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of last week.

The students attended workshops to learn what it takes to be an entrepreneur, and in groups had to develop a product idea and prepare a business plan. The students came up with a diverse range of ideas, including a unique icecream cone that minimises sticky hands, a health food box with customised menus, and a job-finding website. On Friday, the groups presented their concepts to a selection of judges from the business community in a Dragon's Den-type format.

After viewing 10 amazing presentations, the judges decided the three winning groups were:



1st place: Green Guys (Lawrence Zhao, Marcelo Reyes-Tokuma, Hugo Wong, Andrew Sang and Samuel Reeves), who came up with a way of teaching young people about composting.

2nd place: My Menu (part of the team is pictured above right during their pitch). 3rd place: Snack Attack.

Adi, aged 18, left MAGS last year and went on to play a starring role as Suburbs New Lynn reclaimed the Hedley Howarth Trophy.

From taking 4-44 for Auckland A against Wellington to taking 14 wickets on his Suburbs debut, Adi has shown his prowess as a wicket-taker with his leg-spin bowling. Last year, as 1st XI Boys Cricket Captain, Adi was named Auckland Cricket's Secondary School Players' Player in their Cricketer of the Year Awards for 2019/20.

Adi was also part of the NZ team that finished fourth at the 2020 ICC Under-19 Cricket World Cup in South Africa.
