One of those first-day students was Charlie Barr (pictured below, second from left at the rear, with the Foundation Prefects of 1922). Charlie had spent his early secondary schooling at Auckland Grammar School and, like so many of those first Albertians, he had been 'directed' to complete his education at the new Grammar School out west!

Charlie immediately made his mark at his new school and his leadership ability saw him recognised as part of the Foundation Prefect team. He also played for the Rugby 3rd XV and was a sergeant in the Cadet Corps.

Fast forward 100 years and Charlie's great granddaughter and current Year 13 student Edie Ancell has repeated that feat, becoming Deputy Head Girl!

I doubt that Charlie, who went on to become a stock agent and land agent, would have ever thought that one day his male *and female* descendants would follow in his footsteps through the gates of what was then a fiercely protected male-only institution. But I certainly know he would have been immensely proud of Edie and her siblings Frede and Ike – three young people continuing the legacy laid down by the first Albertians!

Only 325 days to go! What a celebration we have in store!

Isaiah placed 5th overall (for prepared and impromptu speeches combined, despite a five-point time penalty), and Awanui placed 4th, having only missed out on 3rd place by five points, with the top three speakers all from Kura Kaupapa Māori (full immersion schools).

Mekal Covic composed the work called *Two Worlds*. The first movement is *Forlorn*, *Forgotten World*, and the second movement is *War-Torn*, *Malicious World*.

And XII Strings (Bella Houghton, Daniel Zhang, Celestine Howard), a violin trio, who performed Capriccio No 1 for 3 Violins, Opus 2 by Friedrich Hermann, and sustained the virtuosity to the very end."
