## Excellence in Girls Education ... Another Chapter Begins



Tena koutou ki te whanau o Mount Albert Grammar School.

This week our Board of Trustees unanimously approved the establishment of a boarding facility for girls at MAGS from 2021.

This milestone decision comes as we celebrate 20 years of girls at MAGS, and the opening of this facility promises to

be a fantastic way to mark our 100th year as a school next year.

Negotiations are underway with a highly regarded organisation that will partner with the school to run the hostel on our behalf.

This significant commitment by our Board could be seen as history repeating. In 1927, five years after MAGS first opened its doors, the then Headmaster Fred Gamble and the Board of the day approved the purchase of a property in New North Road to offer boarding to boys from outside Auckland.

It took another 45 years for the current purpose-built boys boarding house (School House) to be built on site. Likewise, opening our girls hostel next year begins the journey towards equity for girls and families from outside the MAGS zone who also wish to access the exceptional educational experience on offer. Just like boys boarding, this is a long-term vision that will evolve over time.

The positive impact of 'House Boys' on the MAGS culture speaks for itself. Generations of Albertians have emerged from School House to become leaders in their field. New Zealand's greatest Olympian and 'Athlete of the 20th Century' Sir Peter Snell was one such figure. Weekly Notices
