From the Headmaster

Ethics In The Driver's Seat



Tēnā koutou, e te whānau o Mount Albert Grammar School.

This week I have been speaking to senior students about serious safety concerns we have for some who are driving cars to school each day.

A number of students are breaking the law on a daily basis – primarily by driving passengers while holding only a Restricted or Learner Driver Licence.

As young, inexperienced drivers, these students are flirting with serious legal and human consequences.

Apart from voiding any insurance policies on vehicles, students breaking their licence conditions risk criminal prosecution if they crash and cause injury to others.

And if students don't think they will crash, then they need to take note of statistics provided by Waka Kotahi that show a Restricted Licence holder is **10 times** more likely to crash if carrying passengers. They are also **four times** more likely to be involved in a fatal accident.

We are appealing to students from an ethical standpoint when they make decisions about driving. What young person would want to carry the responsibility of the human cost to their family or friends through their actions behind the wheel?

We need parents to help us here – a number of the students referred to above are driving family or parents' cars. We want every MAGS student turning up safely, and on time, to school – every day.

Strong showing at Zones Athletics

On Tuesday, 48 students represented MAGS at the Central/West/East Zone Athletics meet.

Highlights from the day included several Year 10 Girls competing to a high standard, especially on the track.

Peggy Taylor finished 2nd in both the Junior Girls 200m and 300m. Kendra Scally-Tui finished 3rd in both the Intermediate Girls 100m and 200m. Maddie Earley showed her promise as a track and jumps athlete, finishing 2nd in the Junior Girls 70m and 1st in the Triple Jump. Our Junior Girls 4 x 100m Relay also won.

Nate Meikle, who had a busy day on the track running in three different distances, finished 3rd in the Junior Boys 300m. Benjie Fairclough showed his promise as a 400m runner, finishing 1st in the Intermediate Boys section. Elliot Kitchener continued his great progress as a 100m sprinter and finished 2nd in the Senior Boys section.

MAGS students also showed their ability in the throwing events. This included a 2nd and 3rd respectively from Taya Lewis and Anika Todd in the Senior Girls Javelin.

MAGS also nearly had a clean sweep in the Intermediate Boys Shot Put with Jirah Esekia finishing 1st, Kingston Pupuke-Robati 2nd and Dimitri Fruean 4th.
