It took a titanic effort from Holly to hold on for Silver with two scullers chasing her all the way for the medal, while eventual winner Shakira Murfin took the lead early and cruised to victory.

In the other A Finals today contested by MAGS rowers, the Girls U18 Novice Coxed Eight placed sixth and the Boys U18 Novice Coxed Eight placed eighth.

13 Outdoor Education – Whanganui River Journey

From 12-15 March the class travelled south to paddle the Whanganui River. This trip provided students with an event with which they could focus on safety management issues and strategies.

Within this unit, each student was required to complete a Risk Assessment and Management Strategies (RAMS) form from which they could monitor their identified risks while on the trip and implement the strategies that they had devised. Despite heavy rain on day one causing the river to rise and turn brown, the weather thankfully cleared on day two and three. Students enjoyed the extra responsibility of organising everything, including the timings, their equipment and their menu.

12 Outdoor Education – Scuba Diving Trip

Thursday and Friday of Week 8 saw the two 120E classes take part in a diving trip to Goat Island.

This was the culmination of four weeks' work in the pool, learning some of the necessary scuba skills required to dive safely. They were instructed by Epic Scuba, who have been working with the school for four years.

The days provided good conditions for diving and all the students did very well and thoroughly enjoyed the experience. They all showed good levels of personal and social responsibility around all aspects of the activity.





11 Outdoor Education – Wero Whitewater Park Trip

In Week 9, the classes visited Wero Whitewater Park in Manukau to experience whitewater kayaking with an emphasis on self-management and complying with instructions. Students practised their paddling and eddy skills before going up the conveyor belt and into the Grade 2 Tamariki river. The moving water pushed all students outside their comfort zone as they rode the rapids and tried to stay upright.



10 Outdoor Education – Surfing Trip

This term, our Year 10 students have been educated on how to be safe in a beach environment.

They learnt about what causes surf and how to reduce risks at the beach. Pool and classroom learning culminated in a visit to Piha Beach to learn to surf. Thanks to Rapu New Zealand Surf and Snow Tours for their assistance.

Reminder about student absences

Should a student be absent from school we require an explanation from the student's parent(s) within three days of the original absence. The student's mentor will endeavour to make contact via phone or email, however the onus of responsibility rests with the parent(s).

There are multiple avenues to contact the school which are as follows:

- Email sent to attendance@mags.school.nz
- The MAGS app
- Phoning the school on (09) 846 2044

It is important, and a Ministry of Education requirement, that all absences are to be explained. At times, a lack of timely communication regarding absences for which there are good reasons can result in undeserved punitive consequences; at other times communication is important to identify concerns about poor attendance for which there are no good reasons. Good attendance is one of the most important contributing factors for student success and it is important that parents work with the school to maintain accurate records.

Students signing in and out of School:

Should a student need to leave school, they must sign out of school via the Student Centre,

and this includes pre-arranged departures or illness. Should a student suddenly take ill, while at school, they need to visit the school nurse who will assess the need to go home and ensure that their attendance reflects exactly what has taken place. One reason for this request is based within Health & Safety regulations, specifically related to school-based emergencies such as a fire. In such an event, if a student is marked present at school and has left without signing out, we have a Duty of Care to check our facilities to locate them in case they are unable to exit a building.

Lateness:

If a student is late to school, whatever the reason or the time of day, they must sign into school at the Student Centre. Again, this is to ensure that a student's whereabouts is known if there is a need to locate them.
