Jude Hancock, a Kowhai Intermediate teacher, is experimenting with using the farm in context with their science studies. There are many opportunities for feeder schools such as Kowhai Intermediate to use the farm with contextual learning ranging from animal science, environmental science and plant science.

Kowhai Intermediate forms an important part of the learning community as many of these students will be part of the future of MAGS.

For some of these students it was their first experience of being on a farm.



Even though the farm is small, the principles around animal husbandry, environmental stewardship and food production are evident.

Brett Harris, the Farm Manager, takes pride in showing students how the MAGS animals are cared for, and the farm looked after for the community.

The Kowhai students had a blast and we look forward to hosting them again in a month's time to do some water testing and monitoring.
