Iconic Building Taking Shape



Tēnā koutou, ki te whānau o Mount Albert Grammar School.

Our newest addition to our MAGS site – The Murray Nairn Building – is taking shape, with this 20-classroomequivalent block due for completion in April next year.

This three-level building, which will carry the name of the third Headmaster of Mount Albert Grammar School, will provide a new

school library on the ground floor along with a large study area for students. The second and third levels will consist of classrooms to house our Social Sciences Faculty.

Of special significance is the large whare wananga which will sit proudly at the northern end of the building. The whare not only recognises the growth in demand for te reo Māori as a subject at MAGS, but also confirms the place of tangata whenua in our school.

Homestay families required

MAGS is still looking for more wonderful families, as we have a large number of International students starting in 2024. This is a great opportunity to learn about a different culture and build lasting friendships.

Our next student intake will be for Term 1, 2024. We will have short- and longterm students, staying for between 10 weeks to a full year. Homestay families are our most popular choice of accommodation as our students benefit from living with an English-speaking family and sharing in the New Zealand family experience.

What are the expectations of a host family?

A host family is expected to provide a clean and comfortable bedroom with a bed, a wardrobe (built-in or freestanding) and drawers, linen and towels, a desk and a lamp and three meals a day.

The application process:

The application process involves police vetting for all family members over 18 years. This is followed by a home visit from the school. This helps us to know a little more about your family's interests and lifestyle and enables us to make a well-informed student match. We pay \$330.00 per week (from 2024) which is paid fortnightly in advance.
