Sports Dinner celebrates huge year



Anika Todd and Roy Tatupu were named Victrix Ludorum and Victor Ludorum respectively for their wide-ranging and impressive achievements in sport.

Last night's Sports Awards Dinner at Alexandra Park saw a huge crowd of students and their whanau celebrating a great year in sport for MAGS.

Anika Todd and Roy Tatupu were named Victrix Ludorum and Victor Ludorum respectively, while the Headmaster's Cup for Team of the Year was shared between three high-achieving teams: the Rugby Girls 1st XV, the Cricket Boys 1st XI and the Basketball Boys Premiers. The Te Aroha Keenan Cup for Outstanding Individual Achievement for Girls was awarded to Summer Temu, while Marlin Toloa won the comparable boys' award – the Olympic Cup. Anika has represented the school in Athletics, Cricket, Football, Curling and Lawn Bowls

this year, and was also selected in the Aotearoa Maori Secondary Schools cricket team, the Auckland Women's A side and the Auckland Hearts Squad. Roy has performed well in both summer and winter codes, competing in Athletics and playing Volleyball and Softball then 1st XV Rugby in the winter season – and he represented Rugby League during tournament week and played a one-off tournament for Netball. Roy was also named in the NZSS Tournament Team for Volleyball this year. In only his second year of playing Rugby he was



selected for the Auckland U18 team and the Blues U18 squad. Summer, pictured top right, is Captain of the Premier Netball team and has played in the team since Year 10. This year Summer was named in the New Zealand Secondary schools team who played Australia in June. She captained the MAGS team back to National

qualification this year and was also named in the NZ U21 squad. Summer received her third Sports Lion award for Netball this year and the trophy for Best Player in Premier Netball.

Marlin, pictured lower right, captained the MAGS NZSS Waka Ama team this year and won the school's first Blue Cap for Waka Ama by winning the U19 W1 race as an U16 at NZSS. He also won the U19 World Championship W6 over 500m and 1000m and is the current National U16 W6 Champion and was placed second in the World U16 W6 long distance competition.

The Team of the Year award was shared between Boys Premier Basketball – AKSS Champions for only the eighth



time in the 50 years of the competition, Boys 1st XI Cricket – AKSS Champions, the second time in 40 years of the competition, and Girls 1st XV Rugby – AKSS Champions for the first time in MAGS history.

Guests also enjoyed a panel discussion, pictured below, that was hosted by students Benjamin Roache and Tito Tipi and featured Albertian sportsmen Paul Roache and Adi Ashok. There was also a musical interlude with a rendition by Hokioramai Dunn, Kairo Ah Kuoi-Simich and Eved Ah Soon of *It's Now or Never*.

Sports Update

Albertians take on 1st XI Hockey teams



Last Friday, Albertians once more played against our Boys and Girls 1st XI Hockey teams. Director of Hockey Mr Dempster said, "The games were played on the Auckland Grammar turf in brilliant conditions with good numbers, particularly in the boys' game!" The girls played first in an even game, the difference being the finishing in front of goal for the Old Girls team. Caitlin Donaldson and MAGS teacher Sharne Roberts were strong at the back for the Old Girls. Chilean international Sofia Castillo Sambuceti and Maisy Simpson dominated the midfield and Briar Tippett and Bethan Grant had fun up front. The Old Girls were lacking numbers so were topped up by MAGS players, and in fact it was Sophie Rednall who scored two late goals to seal the win 4-0 for the Old Girls.

The boys produced a tightly fought match. Shae Iswar scored early with a cracking reverse shot for the Old Boys, but it was the school team that



led after the first period. Two goals to Ollie Swann and one to Oscar Vink gave them a 3-1 advantage. The 1st XI held the ball for long periods and played great attacking hockey down both flanks. The Old Boys changed their tactics after that and fought their way back into the game. Late in the game it was 3-all after Zack Edgerton and Jayden Dahya scored goals then Shae managed to score for a 4-3 win.

We were lucky enough to have vintage old boy Owen Hayward entertain the crowds on the sideline. He was captain of the 1954 team and coached MAGS teams through the 1980s. Goalie Glynn Clarke, who had an outstanding game, and the father of Yashani Bhana from the 1st XI Girls' team were both in his teams.

Mr Dempster said, "Thank you to Year 9 student Hunter Norris who umpired the girls' game and Rakesh Govind, father of 1st XI player Neel Govind, who umpired the boys' game." "What rounded off the day nicely was the introduction of a trophy for the girls. The Simpson family kindly donated the 'Simpson Cup', which Old Girls captain Caitlin Donaldson [above at left, received for the first time from Maisy Simpson].

Mr Dempster added, "We are hoping numbers can grow with the girls to match the boys and we can make this a regular fixture in the MAGS calendar. The after-match makes for an excellent evening. It was good to see so many players, Albertians and parents enjoying the skills displayed on the field as well as the festivities at the Good Home afterwards."
