## New Zealand Qualification Authority

#### **MCEA = MAGS Achievement Certificate**



National Certificate of Educational Achievement – Level 1, 2, 3,

#### **University Entrance**

NZQA Scholarship (different to a University Scholarship)



Corequisite exams

To gain the NCEA Level 1, Level 2 or Level 3 Qualification students must:

- Achieve Literacy (Reading/Writing)
- Achieve <u>Numeracy</u>

There are other possible ways to get Literacy or Numeracy for a few years but any credits gained for Literacy or Numeracy will not count for your overall NCEA certificate



## NCEA Level 1, 2 or 3

To gain NCEA Level 1 students must:

- achieve Literacy & Numeracy
- achieve a total of <u>60 credits at Level 1 or above</u>
- To gain the NCEA Level 2 students must:
- achieve Literacy & Numeracy
- achieve a total of <u>60 credits at Level 2 or above</u>
- To gain the NCEA Level 3 students must:
- achieve Literacy & Numeracy
- achieve a total of <u>60 credits at Level 3 or above</u>



### University Entrance Qualification (UE) Link to Approved UE Domains

To gain the University Entrance Qualification (UE):

- Achieved Level 3 NCEA (see previous slide)
- Achieved UE Literacy (5 Reading/5 Writing) Level 2 or above
- Achieved 14 + credits within 3 (or more) <u>UE approved</u> <u>subjects</u>/domains.

Some different Universities and different Degrees have more specific requirements than just gaining UE.



#### **Assessment Types** Link to Assessment types

**Externally Assessed Standards** – Work which is set and assessed by NZQA (or MAGS for your MCEA). This includes end of year examinations and portfolios of work for some course – eg: Visual Arts and Technology

Internally Assessed Standards – Work which is set and assessed throughout the year by teachers.



### **Assessment Types**

Standards are worth different number of credits

- Achievement Standards (AS) –eg: 91026 (2.1)
  - Not Achieved (no credits)
  - Achieved; Achieved with Merit; Achieved with Excellence (worth the same credits but go towards Course or Certificate Endorsement)
- Unit Standards (US) eg: 21407
- Not Achieved (no credits)
- Achieved



**Endorsement** Link to NCEA Endorsement info

Course Endorsement (eg:11MA1 Excellence endorsement)

 Can be achieved in an individual course if students achieve 14 or more credits at Achieved, Merit or Excellence, but 3 must be from Externals and 3 from Internals

Certificate Endorsement (eg: NCEA Level 2 Excellence)

 Gained by achieving 50 or more credits at Merit or Excellence at that Level or above. Eg: gaining NCEA Level 2 with 50 credits at Level 2 or 3. There is no requirement for some to be internals or externals.



Scholarship is a monetary award to recognise top secondary school students. Can be awarded as Outstanding Scholarship.

Single subject =\$500; top subject =\$2000; Other awards can be up to \$10,000 {need to have achieved at least 3 Outstanding Scholarships in one year}

Approximately 3 percent of all students studying each subject at Level 3 are awarded Scholarships If they reach the standard set.

Scholarship exams are externally assessed and are an additional set of exams. Th<u>ey do not attract credits, nor contribute towards a qualification.</u>
