### NCEA Level 1



- Achieve 10 credits towards Level 1 Literacy
- Achieve 10 credits towards Level 1 <u>Numeracy</u>

(some Level 2 and Level 3 standards can count for this)

- To gain NCEA Level 1 students must:
  - Achieve a total of <u>80 credits at Level 1 or above</u> (including 10 L1 Literacy and 10 L1 Numeracy)



#### NCEA Level 2

- To gain the NCEA Level 2 students must:
- Achieve a total of <u>60 credits at Level 2 or above</u>
- Achieve 20 credits at Level 1 or above
- So, a total of 80 credits (all 80 could be at L2 or above)
- Must have 10 L1 Literacy and 10 L1 Numeracy

(some Level 2 and Level 3 standards can count for this)



**NCEA Level 3** 

To gain the NCEA Level 3 students must:

- Achieve a total of <u>60 credits at Level 3 or above</u>
- Achieve 20 credits at Level 2 or above
- So, a total of 80 credits (all 80 could be at L3)
- Must have 10 L1 Literacy and 10 L1 Numeracy

(some Level 2 and Level 3 standards can count for this)



# **University Entrance Qualification (UE)**

To gain the University Entrance Qualification (UE):

- Achieved Level 3 NCEA (see previous slide)
- Achieved Level 2 UE Literacy (5 Reading/5 Writing)
- Achieved 14+ credits within 3 (or more) <u>UE approved</u> <u>subjects</u>/domains.

Some different Universities and different Degrees have more specific requirements than just gaining UE.



# University Entrance Literacy (UEL)

University Literacy (Level 2) is o<u>ften required for</u> <u>Tertiary providers</u> (eg: Unitec, MIT) even though it is not a requirement to gain NCEA Level 2 or indeed NCEA Level 3.

Very good to aim to get UE Literacy by the end of Year 12 even if not planning to go to University.



## **Assessment Types**

Externally Assessed Standards – Work which is set and assessed by NZQA. This includes end of year examinations, the Mathematics Common Assessment Task (MCAT), and portfolios of work for some course – eg: Visual Arts and Technology

Internally Assessed Standards – Work which is set and assessed throughout the year by your teachers.



## **Assessment Types**

Standards are worth different credits

#### Achievement Standards (AS)

- Not Achieved (no credits)
- Achieved; Achieved with Merit; Achieved with Excellence (worth the same credits but go towards Course or Subject Endorsement)

#### Unit Standards (US)

- Not Achieved (no credits)
- Achieved



Endorsement

Course Endorsement (eg:11MA1 Excellence endorsement)

Can be achieved in an individual course if students achieve 14 or more credits at Merit or Excellence, but 3 must be from Externals and 3 from Internals

Certificate Endorsement (eg: NCEA Level 1 Excellence)

 Gained by achieving 50 or more credits at Merit or Excellence at that Level or above. Eg: gaining NCEA Level 1 with 50 credits at Level 1, 2 or 3.
