Take your first step on a vocational pathway while still at school.

A new course for Year 12 students in 2017, run in partnership with Unitec.

Choose from **Automotive Engineering** or **Building Skills**



Selected students spend one day a week at Unitec, and four days at MAGS undertaking a dedicated course that complements their chosen vocational pathway.

At Unitec they will learn:

Automotive Engineering

- Learn about automotive maintenance, repair and engineering
- A hands on, practical approach to learning with staff who have an abundance of real world experience
- Start your journey towards a career as a Business Owner, Automotive Mechanic Technician, Branch and Service Manager, Research and Developer, Transport Management or Automotive Lecturer

Building Skills

- A hands on, practical course with experienced lecturers who have worked in the field
- Learn how apprenticeships work and how to connect with them
- Start your journey towards a career as a Business Owner, Carpenter, Boat Builder, Furniture and Cabinet Maker or in a variety of other pathways

Their school-based subjects will be:

- Physics (tailored to Automotive Engineering or Building)
- Technology
- English
- Business Studies
- Maths

The Unitec course and school subjects all offer credits toward NCEA Level 2. Whether you're interested in apprenticeships, looking to undertake tertiary study or training on the job, NCEA Level 2 is the minimum you need to show you have the skills, competencies and knowledge valued in the workplace.

MAGnet students are expected to/may return to MAGS for Year 13 and the opportunity to do a Level 3 course with Unitec, and then, if a vocational pathway appeals, continue with an apprenticeship full time on leaving school.

Experience on a MAGnet course will give preferential entry to Unitec's training programmes.
