
## **SEMESTER COURSES (Table C)**

- 4 periods per week for half a year (semester)
- Decisions on which semester students will study the course will be determined by timetabling constraints.
- If a student wishes to choose Art for one semester only, they can choose EITHER 10AR1 OR 10AR2. The semester will be determined by timetabling constraints.
- If a student wishes to choose Art for the whole year, they should choose BOTH 10AR1 AND 10AR2

## **Possible Combinations**

- One subject from Table A and two from Table
   B or
- 2. One subject from Table A and two subjects from Table C or
- 3. Four subjects from Table B or
- 4. Two subjects from Table B and two subjects from Table C or
- 5. Four subjects from Table C.

Getting Started with Online Course Selection








# 2. Let us know whether you are returning next year

If it doesn't automatically ask you for this information, you can select Leaving Intentions from the home page and then you can select Course Information



## 3. Understanding the Menu Bar and Options



Once you have selected 'Course Information' you can select 'Courses for Me' by clicking on the three dots if it is not already showing.

### **Courses for Me**

 This will show you the list of courses that you are eligible to choose based on your current year and current courses. The options will show in their Table group as above.

### My Courses

From the 3 dots, you can select 'My Courses'. This will show you the courses you have selected for 2026 and within this menu you can also Remove courses if you have changed your mind. You will automatically be enrolled in English, Maths, Science, Social Science Studies and PE.

#### **Faculties**

- This will show you all the courses available at MAGS. You can use this to find a course that you may not be eligible to automatically select but can put in a 'Request Exemption' to be considered for the course.

- 4. As a Year 9 student you will already be entered into
- English, Science, Mathematics, Social Studies and Physical Education

You will then have 4 Options left to select. Note: if you choose an option from Table A, it will count as 2 of your 4 options.

You need to consider your options first to know which table you will select Health from.

You can choose one of the following combinations between the tables

One subject from Table A and two from Table B or
One subject from Table A and two subjects from Table C or
Four subjects from Table B and two subjects from Table C or

**Two** subjects from **Table B** and **two** subjects from **Table C** or **Four** subjects from **Table C**.



Note that the language options may not run in **both** Table A and Table B depending on the uptake of these options.

- 5. Once you have <u>had your Options checked with your Mentor</u> on your handout
- Select the course you want in 'Courses for me'
- Make sure you are selecting the course from the right Table
- Remember to check the prerequisites and Pathway






- 6. If you are not able to automatically select a course it will say why, but it is possible to request a special exemption if necessary (Request Exemption). It is advisable to speak to the teacher in charge first.
- This request will not count as one of your main choices. You will still need to select up to 4 options and you can be removed from one if your request exemption is aapproved

It may take some time to get a response to this request so please complete your other options.

### Possible reasons:

- If you are not studying a prior course required for automatic selection
- If choosing one course means you can not study another course at the same time (do not select Request exemption in this case).
- If you are not in the current year to be able to select the course.



### **SPORTS ACADEMIES**

Some of the Sports Academies can be chosen within the Table B options and will be taught throughout the day as part of the 8 option lessons.

Students can only choose **ONE** of these Sports Academies from Table B without special exemption through the Director of Sports Academies (TeAroha Keenan: tearoha.keenan@mags.school.nz)


Other Sports Academies take place in the morning. If you are not already in one of these morning Academies then please contact the Director of Sports Academies for more information on how to sign up to them.

## 7. Reviewing your Selected Courses

Once you have selected all your courses you will be able to Review your selected courses by selecting 'My Courses'

Once all options have been selected you can click 'I'm Complete' However, you can still go back and Remove or change courses after clicking 'I'm Complete'
